<b>Bigger slide</b> (Y5 Dove)	<ul> <li>We have discussed possible additions to the adventure zone. Swift class added that they would also like to put a trampoline on the field.</li> <li>We have brilliant outside equipment already! Let's see what other schools have.</li> <li>A few years ago, Ms Ramsay took a group of children to visit a School Council at a school just south of Bristol.</li> <li>She would be a good person to talk to about making a similar visit this year.</li> </ul>	• <b>Mr Wells:</b> ask Ms Ramsay if she knows of any local schools that we could visit.
Playpod equipment (Y5 Owl)	<ul> <li>Fatoumata spoke to Dove class about using the playpod equipment safely and sensibly.</li> <li>Councillors felt that there had been improvements in behaviour.</li> <li>Shania offered to work with Owl class to design a poster to remind children of good ways to play at lunchtime.</li> </ul>	• Year 5 councillors: plan or design a poster and bring it to the next School Council meeting.
Behaviour chart (∀4 Swallow)	<ul> <li>Swallow class thinks there should be another colour above gold on the behaviour chart.</li> <li>We voted, and 5 out of 10 councillors agreed.</li> <li>What happens if someone is on gold and they move up?</li> <li>Some classes apparently have 'double gold'. Is this something that happens across the school?</li> </ul>	• <b>Mr Wells:</b> ask Ms Ramsay to make it clear what happens when someone is on gold. Can they move up any further?
Water fountain (Y6 Kestrel)	<ul> <li>We had a long discussion about water fountain issues.</li> <li>It often has sand in it from children washing their hands after playing in the beach.</li> <li>There is sometimes a long queue of children waiting, and they don't always get to drink before the whistle blows.</li> <li>If you have dirty or sandy hands, they should be washed in the toilets.</li> <li>There is a tap inside the beach hut – is it connected to a water pipe?</li> <li>The tap by the greenhouse, in the garden – could that be used to wash hands or fill bottles?</li> <li>Lunchtime staff used to fill jugs from the kitchen and bring plastic cups out for children to drink from.</li> <li>Many of these issues might be solved if everyone had a water bottle. It may be possible to find a local business to help us buy one for each child to keep at school.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Mr Wells: speak to Fatoumata and Trevor about drinks from jugs and plumbing for the beach tap.</li> <li>Mr Wells: speak to Ruth to find out about bottles.</li> </ul>
