I am looking forward to doing some work with our school parliament to get the children in the school to help look at our curriculum from their own lived experiences.

CLASS NENS

YEAR 1 This week we practised on stage and learnt all 6 songs for our performance. As authors, we wrote letters to the alien from our story 'The Way Back Home' and designed and described aliens too. As mathematicians, we found missing numbers and became fluent with out numbers bond to 10. Please help your child learn their lines for the performance.

YCAP Z This week was testing week and everyone in Year 2 put in a fantastic effort to their English and maths papers. As historians we learnt about The Clifton Suspension Bridge and the Concorde! Please practise the 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables. Read with your child 5 times a week.

SEAR 3 This week we focused on fractions, we were able to order fractions by size. In author writers we finished our story about a gladiator fight. In enquiry we were engineers and we cooked and ate our own Roman dish! Please read with your child at least <u>3 times a week and ask them questions about their reading</u>. Please complete the homework sheet.

This week, Year 4 finished our class text 'Libba' and wrote first person retells from Libba Cotton's perspective. They worked hard to include thoughts, feelings and fronted adverbials. In maths, we continued our work on fractions and decimals, and as engineers we studied 2 inventors of some early electric guitars. At home, put each spelling word into a sentence that makes sense in your homework book. Please read with your child at least <u>3 times a week</u>. Practise your 9 times tables including division facts and doing them out of order.

EAR 5 In maths this week, we converted units of measure and explored the concept of volume. As authors, we edited and published our stories. As scientists we learnt about reversible and irreversible changes. At home, ask your child to spot reversible and irreversible changes that occur around the home.
