There has been lots of exciting learning around the school this week. It was great to see Year 6 exploring the grounds and classifying the living things they found - as Carl Linnaeus would have done in the 18th Century. Year 3 have spent the week immersed in their science experiment to discover how shadows change when you move them closer or further away from a light source.



Find your child's class to read about what they have been learning this week - and how you can help at home!

Reception

Year 1

This week we learnt about blending sounds together to make a word (e.g. 'r' 'a' 't' = rat). We also developed our fine motor skills during our Funk Finger exercises. At home, please play 'I spy' with your child e.g. 'I spy with my little eye something that goes 'h - a - t'. This will help our blending skills.

We had a special visit from a nurse from the Children's Hospital this week. We also learnt about 'one more' and 'one less' than a number, and wrote adjectives for two characters from our book; 'Avocado Baby'. At home, read with your child every day for 10 minutes. Practise adding one more and taking away one from any number up to 20. Please check your child is writing all their letters the right way round.

Year 3

This week we investigated what happens to the size of a shadow if you move the object further from the light - ask your child what they found out! We also wrote our own versions of Rama and Sita and explored place value counters as mathematicians. At home, encourage your child to practise their times tables and read with them as much as possible.

Year 4

As Authors, we wrote setting descriptions of a Castle from our book called 'Frogspell'. As Mathematicians, we practised counting in 1000s and adding and subtracting 1000 from numbers. We also researched different historic eras in British History such as the Romans, Vikings, Victorians, Saxons, Tudors and Georgians. Then we worked out who came before who in chronological order. At home, make sure your child practises their weekly spellings.

We have been historians and scientists this week, learning about the work of Carl Linneus and Charles Darwin and learning about living organisms on our playground! As mathematicians, we secured our knowledge on long multiplication and short division and as authors we wrote a narrative about our own version of the kidnapping scene in Beetle Boy. What a lot of learning! At home, please read with your child for 15 minutes daily and ask them questions about what they have read.

Year 2

This week, as Authors Year 2 retold the story 'Pattan's Pumpkin.' In maths, we practised adding and subtracting by counting on and back. We have also been fantastic Scientists, we looked at what makes a healthy diet and where food comes from. At home, read with your child every day for 15 minutes - this is so important! Practise counting forwards and backwards to 100. This will help them to add and subtract.

Year 5

As Authors, we wrote story openings that engaged the reader - using all of our new year 5 sentence techniques. We finished our place value unit in maths, learning to read and write Roman Numerals. Our enquiry has led us to thinking about jobs and trades in our local area in the past 100 years. On Monday we will visit a glass factory to find out how glass is made. At home, practise your times tables up to 12 x 12.
