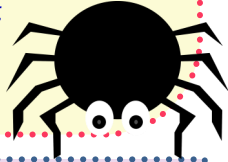
- Trousers (not denim) or knee length skirt - black, grey or navy blue. Black leggings or dark tights may be worn with a skirt.

What have we been learning?

Year 1

This week we worked hard changing the main characters in the Three Little Pigs story. In Maths, we learnt to add on and used this to solve problems. We also learnt an African fable called Anansi the Greedy Spider as part of Black History week. **At home, please support your child in learning to add on 1 and 2 to different numbers.**



Year 2

This week we worked hard to write our own discovery stories about aliens! In Maths we learnt to count in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s and used this to solve problems. We also been learnt about African fables as part of Black History week. **At home, please support your child to learn their 3 times tables.**



Year 3



We worked hard inventing our own warning stories in English.

We were very busy in Maths this week; ordering numbers on a number line, finding 10 and 100 more/less of numbers and counting in 50s!

At home, practise counting forwards and backwards in steps of 2, 5, 10, 50 and 100.



Year 4

Year 4 created their own newspaper reports this week. In Maths we learnt to partition 4 digit numbers.

We also found out lots about South African history, as part of black history week. **At home, please check your child is confident with times tables.**

Year 6

This week was Black History week and we learnt about the Windrush migration from 1948. We looked at historical sources and produced a piece of drama to show the rest of the school. In Maths, we revised addition, subtraction and multiplication, ready to move on to division next week. In English, we looked at how brackets are used in writing and then planned a persuasive letter to Sasha to let us stay with her to escape the evil Rakov! We also had a great time at LifeSkills on Monday! **At home, practise the 7, 8 and 9 times table ready to use next week - and read for at least 20 minutes per**



Year 5



On Wednesday this week Hrothgar the Viking spent the day with Year 5! He told us Viking tales, showed us the weapons Vikings used and taught us how to play hnefatafl. In English we edited our innovated sagas and in maths we worked with place value numbers up to 1 million. **Please listen to your child read every day and ask them questions about what they have read.**
