

Annual Report

I October 2018 - 30 September 2019

Friends of Hannah More secures grant funding and financial support from local businesses to provide some of the 'extras' for the school community. We fund parent courses (with crèche running alongside), trips, playdays and family swims. Friends also subsidise camp costs, travel and school uniform, where families have a particular need. We aim to develop and support families and to enable everyone to feel that they belong and are welcome in the Hannah More community.

Parent courses

- 73 sessions
- 143 attendees
- 5 partnerships

Workshops for new Reception parents in September led on to a 'Help your child with Maths' course, taught by WEA and two parenting courses, one of which ran in Somali. The other was run by the Mindful Parenting Community Project. Other courses included Netball, Sewing, Cycling and First Aid. All courses had free crèche provision running alongside.









Books! We received around £1,750 (donations and books) from various businesses for 'Hub New Arrivals'. This included £250 from Deloitte, £220 raised at a special 'bake off' by local company Limbs & Things, donations from the Ibis hotel and Gardiner

Haskins, plus around 200 new books donated by the charity 'Give a Book'.
